This diary journal made to record all activities in the classroom to investigate as well as to explore the real problem faced by the teacher while conducted teaching process using the simulation. This recording process is started at the half first semester of Elementary School (June 23 until August 1, 2008). The result of this record used for requiring one of research instruments to collect data. The recording process formulated as follows:

1st meeting (June 23, 2008)

Teacher's roles and activities: Model, interview and simulation.

The teacher came into the class, the class so crowded and tried to calm them down and tried to arouse student's attention by greeting them, but as it was predicted, there was no response from the students. The students were busy with their small private conversation with their mates. Once again, the teacher tried to arouse their attention to the lesson by knocking the blackboard and students still did not pay attention. The teacher started the lesson by asking them whether they were interested in English or not. They answered; No, then. The teacher continued the question by asking them the reason they were not interested in English. They answered; because they did not understand about the meaning of English words, then the teacher continued the question do you like studying English with playing and in the real situation. Only for a few minutes, again, the class went to a notice. This condition was on until the bell rang.

2nd meeting (July 14, 2008)

Teacher's roles and activities: Model and Simulation.

In this time, the teacher just came into the class, greeted the students and closed to the chair. Nothing was done but keeping my searching on student's behavior. The teacher started the lesson by greeting by saying *Hallo and Good morning* and give some information about the students material then the teacher give some pictures to the students and ask them to understand about the context

where the dialog use. Then, as *whilst-teaching*, the teacher started the lesson by giving stimulate to the students about greeting and make the simple dialog.

4th meeting (July 21, 2008)

When the teacher started the class by greeting it was predicted, there was no response from the students. The students were busy with their small private conversation with their mates. Then, as whilst-teaching, the teacher started the lesson by giving some picture to the students about the context where the dialog used. After that, the teacher asked the students to make the simple dialog with their pairs in front of the class related the topic.

Moreover, the teacher continued it by giving additional materials in whilst-teaching and modifying the question type.

Seventh meeting. On this meeting the teacher gave the test to the students took the score to look for the students' ability in speaking used oral test. Finally, based on the searching activities, the partner concluded that the interaction between teacher and students were improved using stimulatory through teaching learning activity or class activities. Based on the indicators of interaction above, finally, the researcher concluded that the strategy applied can improve teacher students instruction at the fifth grade of SDN Pandu Cerme Gresik. It was proved by the observation results of the partner:

- There are, at least, eighty percents of students (eight from ten) who intend to do what the teacher instructed.
- All students (one hundred percent) want to answer teacher's questions using English correctly.
- There are, at least, seventy percent of students (seven from ten) who raise their hands up to clarify teacher's instructions or to answer teacher's question when they do not understand. All students wanted to practice simple dialogs with both the teacher and other students individually and in pairs.
